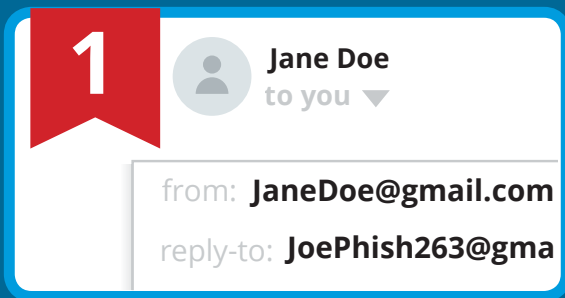


9 BEC Attack Red Flags

Business Email Compromise



"Reply to" email address does not match "From" email address



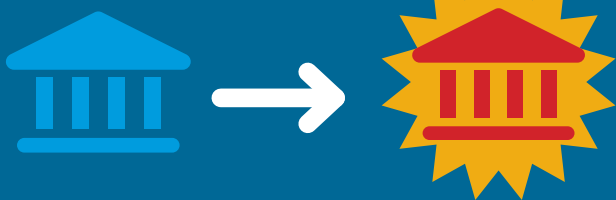
Vendor payment requests from a new email address



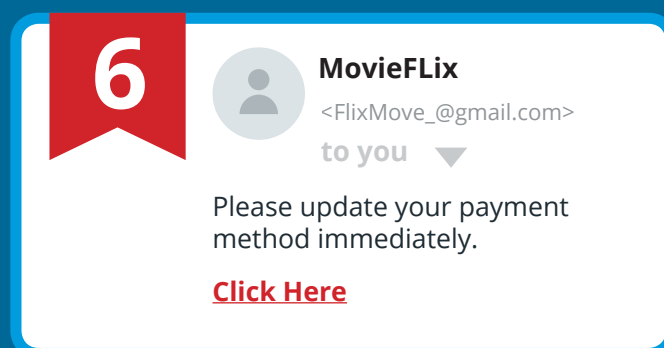
Vendor payment requests with new routing numbers and/or account numbers



Requests for payment at the end of the day, or before weekends and/or holidays



Requests for wire transfers to a new account



Any "urgent" or "confidential" requests for payment



Requests for payment without justification



Requests for payment to a personal account



Requests for payments of unusual amounts

The best way to stop a BEC attack is to evaluate every request for money or sensitive data carefully.
